Please note that ANY PASPORTS posted to the Republic of Ireland will incur an additional postage fee of £10 and all other transactions will incur £5 additional postage fee.

Should anybody in Ireland wish to continue to receive the STAGBI newsletter, you can do so for a £20 fee.

PAYMENTS can be made by cash, cheques /PO (payable to STAGBI) or BACS (contact STAGBI for bank details). Please note STAGBI **cannot accept** Euro Postal Orders or cheques.

Reminder about your responsibilities as a horse owner as required by current EU & DEFRA regulation:

- YOU are required to register a foal within 6 months of birth or before 30st November of the year of birth (to meet this criteria STAGBI require that all registrations are received by STAGBI **before 31st October**)
- YOU are responsible for ensuring ALL your horses now have a microchip
- As a new owner YOU are required to notify the PIO of a change of ownership within 30 days of purchasing the horse.
- If you have imported a horse into the country YOU are required to register the horse within 30 days of import (this includes horses that have an existing passport that are imported from EU countries).
- YOU are responsible of reporting the death of a horse within 30 days and the passport returned to STAGBI within 30 days.

NEWS & NOTICES

❖ MATING CERTIFICATES IN 2021

As of 2020, the limit to the number of mating certificates is reviewed annually. This limit will be based on the total of mating certificates issued in the previous 3 years.

The number of mating certificates issued for each stallion for **2021 SEASON WILL BE LIMITED TO 50 PER YEAR**. Please be reminded that it is not possible to register a foal without a valid mating certificate.

❖ ANNUAL STALLION FEE

As of 1st April 2021, an ANNUAL STALLION FEE will be applied to all registered stallions applying for mating certificates.

Annual Fee of £25 when applying for less than 10 mating certificates / year

Annual Fee of £50 when applying for 10 or more mating certificates / year

This Annual Fee will be directed into the new STAGBI British Championships Prize Fund, a new series of Races introduced by STAGBI for 3 and 4 year olds, sired by a Stallion Standing in GB

❖ MOVEMENT OF HORSES TO AND FROM IRELAND

You will now be aware that there are now significant changes in the process of moving horses between GB and Ireland.

STAGBI have compiled some guidelines and can be seen in the previous newsletter, on the website and on STAGBI Facebook page. The best advice we can give you is PLAN AHEAD and get yourself an experienced transporter.

❖ IMPORTED HORSES

You are reminded that when you are submitting a registration for an imported horse, you are also required to submit the **EXPORT HEALTH CERTIFICATE (OR INTRA TRADE CERTIFICATE)**.

This certificate will have been issued by the Dept of Agriculture in the country of origin of departure. The certificate will have accompanied the horse whilst travelling and should be given to you along with the horse's passport when you receive your horse. This applies to horses imported from Ireland, mainland Europe or transiting via Europe from North America – Trotters and Pacers.

Failure to submit this certificate will result in a delay in processing the registration and the application will be referred to DEFRA /APHA. Such a referral may result in the horse being impounded until further blood results are performed and that the horse is refused registration on the instruction of APHA.

❖ STAGBI REGISTERED HORSES in IRELAND

As a result of the end of the transition period for Great Britain to leave the EU, as of 1 January 2021, there are significant changes to horse owners in GB and Ireland. If you own a STAGBI registered Standardbred then these changes will apply to you.

Along with all other breed societies (all species) in GB, STAGBI has received notification from the UK Government that as of 1 January 2021, British Breed Societies will not be granted extended breeding programmes into the EU Member States. This means that Standardbreds in Ireland should now be registered in the Irish Standardbred Stud Book

Since the IHRA established their own Stud Book in 2016 and became independent of STAGBI, many in Ireland have already exported their horse's registration into the IHRA Stud Book and/or onto the IHRA Database.

However, there remains a significant number of STAGBI registered Standardbreds in Ireland that are yet to be exported/ transferred from STAGBI to IHRA.

EU regulation now requires that if you live in Ireland and your horse(s) are in Ireland then you need to transfer those horses into the IHRA Stud Book and/or onto the IHRA Database. Your horse's STAGBI passport remains valid, but you are required to take immediate action so that you comply with EU Regulation. You will need to submit an application form to STAGBI so that your horse's details can be processed and that your horse's registration is exported to the IHRA.

❖ ON LINE DATABASE

As we are approaching the breeding season and you what to find out more about horse's pedigrees or want to create a hypothetical breeding, then just go to the STAGBI on line breeding database.

Go to www.standardbred.org, click on horse info and follow the instructions to log on.



ON LINE STANDARD BRED SALE

.Throughout this testing year a number of traditional outlets for breeders to buy and sell their stock have been lost or postponed. As a result, STAGBI are delighted to announce that we will be working in partnership with Sellhorse.co.uk to bring Standardbred Online Sales to the membership

SELLING A HORSE

ALL horses entered have to be STAGBI registered (or registered with any other recognised international breed registry) and hold a valid Equine Passport.

Go to our Sellers page on the website where you will find a detailed guide to submit your entry.

HOW TO ENTER: Simply go to www.sellhorse.co.uk/entry-form, **entry is FREE.** Horse's details will be verified by STAGBI. STAGBI will provide a 4 generation pedigree box for the catalogue or a full Pedigree Page can be provided by STAGBI if required.

Pictures and videos are mandatory and should be attached to your email. We highly recommend following our entry criteria, front, rear and two side view images are required Along with a 'walk away' and 'trot back' video clip and/or a free trotting/pacing video. You may also upload any vetting information you may have to display to your prospective purchasers. Once we receive your information, we will then create your advert and catalogue page.

Choose your start price and a reserve if you have one. Don't worry if you miss something, our friendly team verify each advert and will be in touch. Then all you have to do is sit back and watch the bids fly in.

Prior viewing is encouraged and we offer unlimited photo, video and description characters. Your lot will also be published on our Facebook & Instagram for maximum exposure.

COLLECTION: Purchasers must collect lots within 7 days. Funds will be released to the Vendor upon successful collection of the lot.

No listing fees, the only time you pay is when you sell. Our 5% sellers fee will be deducted from your sale upon transfer. Your buyer will securely transfer funds to sellhorse.co.uk and then from Sellhorse to yourself.

BUYING A HORSE

As a purchaser with Sellhorse.co.uk your journey should be straight forward.

Register with us so that you can start bidding today.

The Sale will last 2 days and you can place a maximum purchase price from the outset or put the horse on a watchlist and follow the bidding as it happens. Bidding is in £25 increments with the winning balance to be paid upon completion of the auction. A 5% Buyers Fee will be added, but capped to a maximum of £250. Non payment will lead to forfeit of the purchase and the second highest bid will become the winner. Payment is made securely through PayPal. Rest assured your funds are safe as they are held by us and directed straight to your vendor when you collected your new horse. It is then down to you to liaise with the vendor to arrange collection of the horse, longer may be allowed at the vendors discretion in the case of international bids. Prior viewings are encouraged however detailed videos, photographs, and pedigree are all provided alongside a detailed description for your piece of mind.

STAGBI BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIPS

Following the success of the STAGBI Future Broodmares Series over the past number of years and the addition of the now-established Group 1 Golden Girls Final, STAGBI are now proud and excited to announce a NEW SERIES for 2021 and onwards: **THE STAGBI BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIPS**, which will be aimed at **three & four year olds** sired by stallions standing in GB.



STAGBI felt in light of the strength of the 2YO division as a result of the efforts of numerous promoters across the country, that it was time to expand upon the existing 3YO and 4YO divisions, whilst also promoting the breeding of British Standardbreds.

With a **minimum prize fund** for 2021 of £18,000, the series will be made up of **3YO Colts & Geldings, 3YO Fillies, 4YO Colts & Geldings and 4YO Fillies**. The races will be staged throughout GB with **NO NOMINATION OR SUSTAINING FEES**.

Conditions:

- Horses to be sired by a STAGBI registered stallion standing at stud in Great Britain at time of mating*
- For horses aged three and four years old, with colts & geldings and fillies divisions within each age group

CHOOSING A STALLION @ ALABAR

As the Stud Season approaches, STAGBI took the opportunity to ask some individuals in the business about how they choose the right stallion for the right mare. To open the session, STAGBI sought the views of Brett Coffey, General Manager at Alabar Farms, Australia.

When choosing a potential stallion for our mares at Alabar I always look at the mare's pedigree first. I look at the key horses and for me that is her sire and then her maternal lines. Rarely do I personally go further back than five generations. This is probably for no other reason than it is what I grew up doing.

I am big believer in duplicating sires in the middle of a pedigree and then ideally the top and the bottom of the pedigree.

Last season's champion two year old filly Oakwood Annabella is a perfect example of this. She carries a 4 x 4 cross to Cam Fella through Foreclosure's dam and her own dam Carmel Camden. She then also carries a 4 x 4 cross to Western Hanover and a 5 x 5 x 4 cross to Abercrombie through Foreclosure's sire line and through Pan Culottes, the grandam of Oakwood Annabella.

I am not a big fan of re-inventing the wheel, there are plenty of people smarter than me who have been breeding horses for longer, so why not follow in their footsteps?

So, once I have looked at a mare's pedigree I will then at a minimum go look at what stallions have crossed well with the mare's sire and also if there is a particular sire has worked with the family.

I believe it's important to look not only at what has worked but what hasn't.

You are lucky in the UK and Ireland that you have a lot of US bloodlines, so you can easily access good, meaningful data through the USTA's Pathway and Standardbred Canada's TrackIt.

Of course, the other extremely important aspects to look at are type and temperament. When you are planning a mating you should have in your mind a picture of what the horse you are trying to breed will look like.

From there you can choose a stallion that when matched with your mare will hopefully produce a horse that fits the picture in your mind. It doesn't always work, but it definitely won't if you don't try.

Temperament is also hugely important. We have to remember that no matter how much ability a horse might have if they have a bad attitude or are crazy then you won't see the best of them on the racetrack.

For me breeding horses is all about playing the percentages. You have to put the percentages in your favour to succeed. Of course you then also need to hope for a lot of luck!

CHOOSING A STALLION @ HANOVER

Dr Jablonsky, Executive Vice President of Hanover Shoe Farms has years of experience of selecting the right stallion for the right mare. In a recent Q&A session she reflected on how she approaches the decision making progress and some key decisions

Breeding to sell or to keep

You need to decide if you are breeding to sell or breeding for yourself. If you are breeding to race for your own account, you can take more risks and worry less about the commercial response to the pedigree and looks of the foal. You might breed a mare that you know has some flaws, but you know her, you know the family and believe those will not be a factor in the performance of the progeny.

If you are breeding to sell, you will be financially penalized for lack of pedigree, performance in the family tree and the conformation of the yearling. There are too many choices for shoppers at a sale to take a chance on a horse with a glaring weakness. The market is very unforgiving and your yearling must also be sold in a venue where they will be competitive with the others selling.

The calibre of the mare must be compatible with the calibre of the stallion. The most popular stallions are usually syndicated and there may be only a few spots for outside mares and they must be of the highest quality to even be considered.

Breeding Theories

You read through a lot of the pedigree books and articles you see an awful lot '3 x 3; 4 x 4 or 2 x 2 'and being inbred to Meadow Skipper. Do we look at line breeding or outcrosses etc?

Line breeding is breeding within a family, so to speak. Usually three generations back trying to carry on the traits through, it's the great grandfather of the sire line. An outcross would be going absolutely the opposite direction. Trying to reach outside the box, outside the family and trying to make that magic mating, bringing in a stallion who's not found anywhere in four or five generations.

At Hanover, we don't like to breed closer than 3 x 3, so the sire and the dam are the first generation. We don't go any closer than sharing a common ancestor in the third generation (great grandparents). We're big believers in niches. We use Crosses of Gold (<http://pathway.ustrotting.com/>) a lot. We believe that some stallions do better with certain broodmare sires. That is something we are believers in. We will also breed stallions back the best blood of their dam. We've been doing things like breeding mares by Andover Hall to Cantab Hall and vice versa. The good filly American

Jewel goes back to Three Diamonds on both sides, so we don't look at a mare and book her strictly based on her pedigree and who her ancestors are. We make the cross and look at it and we do rely heavily on niches – Andover Hall with Donerail mares and other examples like that.

Choosing a Stallion

With older mares we try to give them the blood that's worked for them in the past. Maybe shake it up a little, maybe go to a son. If a mare's had a lot of good Cam's Card Sharks, maybe go to a son of his.

For the younger mares, we do a lot of it based on looks. We really try to envision what breeding this mare to this stallion will look like. Maybe that's me. We do it by committee, and my part of that committee knows the mare's conformation and what they've had.

So I really want to try to match them up to get a good looking foal. So we're not saying you should breed a good looking foal that has no pedigree, but we really a lot of what the mare looks like. We try to spread it around (to other states). If you don't have a strong inkling to what you want to do with your mare, it's important to place her in the right program, perhaps she would do better in a smaller program, if you're going to sell the foal. Then her foal's pedigree page will be at least on par with other foals in that area.

Conformation

People often ask me how important is size and or confirmation? I think with size, you can help. You certainly don't want to breed a small, fine mare to a small, fine stallion. It's easier to bump a mare up in size or maybe downsize her a little.

With conformation, there are some flaws I've found that are very hard to breed out. But certainly if you can help it, you don't want to breed a mare that toes out to a stallion that toes out himself.

But what is more important, once a mare and stallion start having offspring it's really important what the offspring look like. You have some stallions that you just know what kind of traits they pass. If a mare tends to do the same things with her babies or does it herself, if she is a young mare, you want to avoid that. It's really not scientific. You can't breed a sickle hocked mare to a stallion that's a little straight behind and come out with a perfect curvature to the hock. It does not work that way. You can try it, but you certainly don't want to breed two horses with the same flaw or horses that throw the same flaw unless you have a very compelling reason to do that.

CHOOSING A STALLION @ PEI

Prince Edward Island (PEI) in Canada is a beautiful part of the world and is home to some famous harness horse men and women. It is also the home of Norman Hall, founder and developer of the PEDIGREE MATCHING. Norman has years of experience of studying the patterns of breeding which has resulted in the development of his pedigree software PM Equine for Standardbreds, Thoroughbreds and over performance horses.

In a recent seminar for STAGBI members, Norman gave us a brief insight into the programme and shared with the members some of the successful breeding patterns that mare owners should be trying to achieve when selecting a stallion for their mare.

How Pedigree Matching Works

Norman Hall often asks *"Did you ever wonder why even the best of sires have so many ordinary performers or why a mare of modest breeding can suddenly produce a champion?"* The answer may well be in the "match" of the bloodlines of the sire to those of the dam. The concept of matching bloodlines as a way to develop champions has proven its worth over the years and serious breeders would do well to study the theory and results to see if they can improve their chances of coming up with the right match for their mares. The success of a particular mating does not have to be subject more to luck than good management.

Successful breeders will spend time to research the best matches for their mares and can get most of the information they want through computer reports from the various breed registries.

The information they receive, though, is based on established sires and may be of little help if the boundaries of time, distance and cost make the "perfect" match unavailable or if the sire of interest is a new and unproven sire.

Among small breeders who stand their own stallion there is the tendency to breed all the farm mares to that one stud regardless of the pedigree match. Such matings will, in the long run, result in low success rates and lower prices for yearlings that far offset the short term savings involved. Smart stud owners will trade breedings with other farms to get the match that gives their mares the best chance of success.

The goal of Pedigree Matching then is to find a way to match up the bloodlines in the maternal lines of the sire with the lineage in the bloodlines of the dam.

In the words of the experts this is called "Returning to the sire the best blood of his dam". Pedigree matching is not to be confused with "line breeding" which occurs when the top line of the sire matches the top line of the broodmare sire. This is a simple concept that ignores,

however, the impact of the maternal line of both the sire and the dam on the mating.

Pedigree matching is new in name only as the original basis for the theory is to be found in Wallace's American Trotting Register published in 1871, a publication that was the first attempt of its kind to document the history of the trotter in North America. Wallace was of the opinion that "like begets like" and that breeders would be wise to seek "to unite again two streams that originate in the same fountain, but that had been separated for a few generations." His theories have stood the test of time and are as valid today as they were over 140 years ago.

Successful breeders in the thoroughbred industry such as the Aga Khan and the legendary Federico Tesio derived their success from practising "balanced breeding", a concept that evolved from evidence that inbreeding and line breeding to selected ancestors through sons and daughters was far more successful than through sons alone or daughters alone. This finding confirms in a general way the basis for Wallace's "two streams from the same fountain" theory.

The practice of Pedigree Matching or balanced breeding or whatever name you may want to give it would automatically provide the opportunity for the right genes to express themselves and result in top performers.

Breeding Or Buying the Best

The horse racing world is full of pedigree theories, beliefs, old wives tales and opinions when it comes to making the most important decisions that breeders or buyers must make – What to breed and what to buy with respect to pedigree. The success or failure of an investment in a race-horse hinges on these crucial decisions and a wrong decision can be, at the least, very expensive.

One fact that the reader should be aware of is that the pedigree of the horse, once chosen and delivered in the form of a foal, cannot be changed. The breeder can change the environment within which the foal is raised using best practices, the buyer can retain the best trainer available and protect his investment in other ways. The end result, however, if the pedigree is incorrect, is that best practices in breeding and ownership cannot reverse a bad stallion choice, making that decision the most important one a breeder can make, and the buyer recognize.

A breeder has limited opportunity to make correct stallion decisions for each mare since after several failed matings the damage to the mare and to the breeders reputation is essentially done and the future success of both is compromised.

Patterns Of Success and Percentages

A Pattern of Success can be as simple as the position in the pedigree tree of certain ancestors or as complicated as counting up the number of times the pedigree traces back to some obscure ancestor that you consider important. In fact when you get familiar with pedigrees you will find that, just as in handicapping the races, the patterns of success inevitably have exceptions. It is important to remember, however, that success in owning Standardbreds, like all other sports, is a game of percentages and those who play the percentages in their favour will be the ones to succeed.

To play the percentages you have to know them. One key measuring stick to use in assessing pedigrees is the percentage of performers by a sire that earn \$100,000 or more. Typically a successful sire or broodmare sire will average 15% or better. A yearling is clearly much more than just a combination of a sire and a broodmare sire and indeed every sire has a profile, or pattern, in relation to the mares with which he has most success. One of the most important things you can do when choosing a sire is to create the profile of what works with respect to the mares that produce their top performers. Creating a stallion profile is the first step in

making correct stallion choices. A typical profile of the top twenty performers by any sire will show the combination of sire lines in the mare and the extent to which any sire line or indeed individual sire is common across the pedigree.

Doing Your Homework

Like any other serious investment your chances of success are greatly improved when you understand the fundamentals of the business and make use of all the tools and information at your disposal to make the confident decisions needed to improve your percentages. The most important percentage in my mind, however, is the first 18%, the right pedigree. The only factor that can be used with confidence is the correctness of the pedigree – does it fit the stallion's profile - the proven or predicted pattern of success? It is a relatively easy process to find out once you have learned how to do your homework. In today's world of computers, high-speed communications and the Internet, we have a wealth of information upon which to make better, smarter, more confident decisions.

Homework has never been easier and failing to do yours guarantees failed decisions.

STONERIGGS JR 1987 - 2021

On Wed 3 February the sad announcement was made by Brynfawr Stables that the legendary Stoneriggs JR had passed away. His owner Heather Hardwick posted *"It's a sad day at Brynfawr stables as we laid Stoneriggs JR to rest at the great age of 33 years young. JR was a treasured member of our family for many years, JR and dad had a lot of happy days together."*

Stoneriggs JR, bred by the Stoneriggs Stud in Appleby, was born in 1987. By Rajah Lobell and out of Stoneriggs Dixie. But whilst he was born and raised in the hills of Cumbria, as a yearling he headed south to the hills of Mid Wales and to Dennis Hardwicks, Brynfawr Stables, Llandrindod Wells.

The late Dennis Hardwick wasted no time with his new prodigy, winning twice as a two year old. This form held JR in good stead for his three year old year season, winning 5 of his 10 starts and only out of the placings on one occasion. He continued his winning ways as a four year old which included coming off a 30 yard trail, in heavy going to win the 1991 Welsh Classic (driven by Colin Bevan). JR went from strength to strength and as a 6 year old, he was well and truly writing himself into the Record Books. Numerous wins at Free For Alls including the Tregaron Free For All and setting a new track record of 2.02.9 (which he held for 9 years). That was on the Saturday, on Sunday he returned for the Welsh Classic. He won his heat off 20yds, and third in the final beaten two and a half lengths, off an 80 yard trail.

But the true magic occurred a few months previous on a chilly June evening in Wolverhampton. Race 3, The Bradshaw Brothers Butchers Free For All, 11 horses faced the starter: 1) Young Commander (USA) 2) Kohima 3) Stoneriggs JR 4) Dalestar 5) Royal Exchange 6) Viceroy 7) Dale Chief 8) Nijinsky (DEN) 9) Saunders Destiny 10) Jimmy's Decision and 11) Denton Rocket – a magnificent field of free for allers.

JR went off at 4/5, and the win was probably not in doubt, but few could believe the time, a new British Record 1.55.7 decimating the previous record (1.59.4 – Golden Dale). The full result of that historical race

JR's success over the next few seasons continued with more FFA wins at Tir Prince, York (including track record in 1995 1.58.5, Tregaron, Allensmore etc. Top class Free For Alls, maximum trails in handicaps, hard tracks, grass tracks, firm ground, heavy going, this black horse with his characteristic red sheepskin breast plate and matching noseband was a familiar winning sight.

His longevity at the highest level is applauded. JR raced from 2 years of age through to 11 years, from 125 starts, 43 wins (34%) and 34 (62%) placings earning £25,351.

Whilst harness racing followers got very familiar with Stoneriggs JR the racehorse, they soon became very familiar with Stoneriggs JR the sire. Combining his duties on the racetrack and the breeding shed, his first offspring were born in 1991. There are 196 registered foals by him and siring his last foal at 27 years old. His offspring enjoyed various success on the racetrack and some of his familiar offspring includes Fearless JR, Perfect Gem, JJ Kedo, Holme James, Helluvafella, Young Dennis, Rebelwood, CU Sooty, Shifty, Radnor Wood, Dawns Melody, Vodka Express, Grannell Shane, Maple Star, Freya Crazy Daisy, Clint, Lanehouse Stan, Sun Glasses Ron and many many more.

In 2016, Stoneriggs JR was inducted into the BHRC's Hall of Fame, he will remain in the BHRC Record Book for the foreseeable future and be remembered for a very long time.

Whilst it will have been a sad day in Brynfawr, what a wonderful life he had and what a delight it was to see him race. One can only imagine how very proud the Hardwick family were of their equine legend and a once in a lifetime horse.
